THE 5TH INTERNATIONAL CFC CONFERENCE

BERKELEY, CALIFORNIA AUGUST 2 – 4, 2009

The CFC International Conference is a unique learning opportunity for families and professionals to connect throughout the three-day program. The program offers keynote speakers who are experts in their fields, workshops tailored to connect families with others of similar experiences, individual consultations with CFC International Medical Advisory Board members, and childcare programs for children of all ages!

The Doubletree Hotel & Executive Meeting Center at the Berkeley Marina overlooks the San Francisco Bay. The hotel is located 20 minutes from Oakland International Airport, 30 minutes from San Francisco International Airport and convenient to all major highways.

The hotel location offers travelers endless leisure options. Berkeley is known world-wide, especially now, for an abundance of excellent dining, one-of-a-kind shopping, cultural venues, a renowned university and many other experiences.

The city of Berkeley rests in a natural amphitheater, sweeping down from the coastal hills to the shores of San Francisco Bay. You can see out to the far Pacific horizon, framed by the Golden Gate; you can see the distinct skyline of San Francisco; and the gentle peak of Marin County's Mt. Tamalpais.

Closer to home, the city's eastern boundary is crowned by Tilden Regional Park, part of a more than 40 mile long regional park system, and thousands of acres of watershed lands that open the spectacular ridges of the coast ranges to those that cherish the ample green belt.

Los Angeles and southern California deserts are 400 miles to the south, Lake Tahoe, gold country and the High Sierra is a three hour drive to the east. The Redwood empire and Napa and Sonoma wine county is less than an hour away to the north. Sacramento is only eighty miles east; and the charming Sacramento/San Joaquin river delta is just over the hills to the east. Unique San Francisco is minutes west over the Bay Bridge with unique entertainment, shopping, dining and culture.

From beach to golf course to mountain trail, hotel guests have access to scenic beauty and dozens of outdoor activities. On-site hotel amenities include an indoor family pool and spa, indoor lap pool, well-equipped fitness center, and sauna.

When and where is the conference being held?

The CFC International Conference will be held August 2-4, 2009 at the Doubletree Berkeley Marina in Berkeley, California USA.

What is the deadline to register for the conference?

The deadline for Early Registration, including discounted rates, is Friday, May 1st. The deadline for Regular Registration (full-price rates) is Saturday, July 4 th.

How much does it cost to attend the conference?

The costs for Early Registration (**postmarked by May 1st**) are:

Adult (ages 13 and up): \$125
Child (ages 6 - 12): \$75
Person who has CFC Syndrome: No Registration Charge

The costs for Regular Registration (**postmarked May 2nd – July 4th**) are:

Adult (ages 13 and up): \$150
Child (ages 6 - 12): \$100
Person who has CFC Syndrome: No Registration Charge

What is included in the registration cost?

Conference registration fees cover: Saturday evening Welcome Reception on August 1 to meet the Scientific Symposium researchers; Sunday dinner; Monday breakfast, lunch, dinner; Tuesday breakfast, lunch, dinner, conference handouts; all conference workshops and general sessions; individual consultations for new families with members of the CFC International Medical Advisory Board (only scheduled appointments).

Clinic Appointment (Meet privately with the doctors & researchers most familiar with CFC Syndrome):

A team of Doctors will be on hand to meet with you and your children all day Tuesday, August 4th. These appointments will be scheduled on a first come, first served basis as we only have room for 20. We recommend that new families take advantage of this. Please note that clinic appointments are only for new families **registered with CFC International**. You must have sent in the CFC Registry along with photographs and copies of specialist reports. The appointments are an informal meeting with doctors but in no way determine official syndrome confirmation. We will also offer sign up at the conference site to meet with an orthopedic doctor. Dental and ophthalmology exams are open to all registered families and those exams will take place during the day on Sunday. Sign up must be done on page 12.

Do I need to make reservations at the hotel separately and what is the price?

Yes, each family needs to make their own reservations directly with the Doubletree Berkeley Marina by July 17th.

Is childcare provided?

We have arranged for professional child care for only CFC children and their siblings who are registered for the conference. CFC International will be funding the bulk of the bill and ask only for a small donation of \$25 per child toward child care. We cannot accommodate any other extended family members or friends. Please note: we cannot provide one-on-one child care or nursing care. You are required to be in the hotel if your child is in daycare! Daycare is not intended for parents who are enjoying leisure activities outside of the hotel. Registration must be paid for each child who goes to child care, even once. A required child care survey must be completed and returned with your conference Registration packet. If you do not use the child care program then you are responsible for the supervision and conduct of your children at the hotel. We request that you DO NOT bring them with you into conference sessions.

Child Care will be provided all day Monday and Tuesday – please remember that this costs \$25 per child. CFC International will be funding the rest of the bill beyond your \$25 per child donation with the childcare company contracted rate of \$20 per hour. The generosity of our donors and parents who have hosted fundraisers have made the small donation fee of only \$25 per child possible!

Workshop Sessions

On Monday and Tuesday we offer a variety of informative workshops. Top clinicians and researchers will present the latest information in an easy to understand format while allowing you plenty of time for in-depth discussion. The small group format will allow you to delve with greater depth in to the areas that concern you most, while offering one-on one communication with CFC specialists. Note: some workshops are offered multiple times so that you will not miss topics that are most important to you and all questions can be addressed. You'll find workshop descriptions and registration forms in the next pages.

Moms & Dad's Nite Out

We have a conference tradition to provide one night for each parent to get together with other mothers and fathers in the hotel. This relaxed and comfortable hotel suite setting gives parents a chance to chat and make that connection with others who have walked in your shoes. Mom's nite out is Monday and dad's nite out is Tuesday.

What is the Tuesday night Celebration Dinner?

Each Conference hosts a celebration dinner/banquet. The dinner includes our video production of CFC children's photos set to music, the silent auction, and a general atmosphere of community and celebration. All family members are invited to attend the dinner. Guests are also welcome to pay for their meal and attend. The cost for each additional adult guest not registered for the conference is \$30 and the cost for each additional guest child ages 6-12 not registered for the conference is \$15.

Public Transportation

Bay Area Rapid Transport (BART) INFORMATION: (510) 465-BART or www.bart.gov BART is the fast, easy, inexpensive way to get to San Francisco and around the Bay Area. Trains arrive at the SFO International Terminal every 15 minutes.

BART From San Francisco Airport:

The BART station at SFO is located in the International Terminal. It's a short walk from United Airlines in Terminal 3 and a slightly longer walk from Terminal 1. You can also take the free AirTrain from both terminals directly to the BART station. Just follow the signs to AirTrain and board the Red Line train. When you arrive, take the escalator down to the departures level and walk straight ahead to the BART station. Terminals 1, 2 & 3 are approximately a one to three-minute AirTrain ride to the BART station.

International passengers should turn right when leaving customs, walk to the escalator and go up to the departures level. Walk straight ahead and turn left at the art exhibit and you'll see the station entrance.

Get on the Pittsburg/Bay Point line, then transfer to the Richmond line. The Richmond line goes to Downtown Berkeley. It is a 54 minute ride. Once in Berkeley get off BART, take the escalator up to the street and call 510-548-7920 for a free pick up by the Doubletree shuttle van. That is the number for the operator at the Doubletree. The van is not handicapped accessible for wheelchairs. It is about 3+ miles, so not an easy walk. You should give the shuttle about 30 minutes or so to pick you up. If you do not wish to wait for the shuttle you can exit the BART terminal, go up to street level and there is a cab depot right nearby.corner of Center and Shattuck Streets.

BART from the Oakland airport:

Get on the Richmond line and get off at Downtown Berkeley.

Once in Berkeley get off BART, take the escalator up to the street and call **510-548-7920** for a free pick up by the Doubletree shuttle van. That is the number for the operator at the Doubletree. The van is not handicapped accessible for wheelchairs. It is about 3+ miles, so not an easy walk. You should give the shuttle about 30 minutes or so to pick you up. If you do not wish to wait for the shuttle you can exit the BART terminal, go up to street level and there is a cab depot right nearby.....corner of Center and Shattuck Streets.

BART Tickets Children 4 and under ride free. Everyone else must have a BART ticket. BART tickets are like debit cards with stored value. All BART stations have automatic ticket vending machines that accept nickels, dimes, quarters and \$1 coins, as well as \$1, \$5, \$10 and \$20 bills. You can also use a credit card in select machines. BART's fare structure is built on a mileage-based formula therefore weekly or monthly passes are not available.

When you enter BART, insert your ticket into the fare gate and it will be returned to you. Use the same ticket when you exit. The correct fare will be automatically deducted and tickets with remaining value will be returned. If your ticket has too little value, a sign on the fare gate will read "Underpaid: Go to Addfare." A nearby Addfare vending machine will tell you how much additional fare you must add to your ticket to exit the BART system.

What kind of weather should we expect in Berkeley in August?

Berkeley has a Mediterranean climate, with dry summers and wet winters as is typical in the Mediterranean region, but with a cool modification in summer thanks to upwelling ocean currents along the California coast, which help to produce cool and foggy nights and mornings. Berkeley's position directly opposite the Golden Gate ensures that typical eastward fog movement will blanket the city more often than its southerly or northerly neighbors. Do not forget to pack a sweater or jacket for the windy and cool evening air and also to use inside the conference facility.

What is proper attire?

Casual, comfortable attire is appropriate for the entire conference. Dressier attire is sometimes chosen, but not required, for the Tuesday dinner and welcome.

CHILDCARE POLICY

It is the goal of CFC International to provide quality and safe childcare at the Conference.

A. Childcare options are offered to all individuals with CFC at the conference. Siblings of CFC children (ages 6 months- 16 years) who do not have CFC are also offered childcare. Individuals must be pre-registered.

A person is not eligible for childcare if s/he requires one-on-one supervision, due to medical, behavioral, or other needs. If during the conference such needs occur for an individual in childcare, the Parent/Guardian will be contacted immediately and asked to remove the child from the childcare program. Childcare supervisors will have the authority to make this decision. Childcare will then become the responsibility of the Parent/Guardian for the remainder of the conference.

B. Acceptance to all programs is based on a first-come, first-serve basis. The maximum number of individuals accepted into childcare will be determined by the number of care providers and our reserved childcare rooms. Attendees must return the registration and release forms to CFC International with the paid conference registration form.

C. The same Parent/Guardian must sign individuals in and out of childcare.

D. Childcare is available only while Parents/Guardians are at conference-related activities. Parents/Guardians must be immediately accessible to childcare providers.

E. Parents/Guardians must administer all medications and tube feedings. Medications cannot be left with any childcare providers or child.

F. Individuals who are ill (fever, cold, etc.) may not participate in childcare.

G. Participation in childcare is dependent upon acceptance of the childcare policy. Parents/Guardians must sign and return the registration and release forms.

H. No children are allowed in the General Session or Workshop rooms in consideration of other guests attending.
